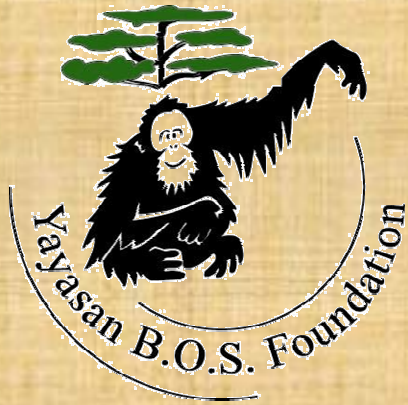

- BOS is an Indonesian non-profit, Non Governmental Organization, working under an official agreement with the government
- BOS has a board of directors, a scientific advisory board, two patrons, all non-paid and 13 sister organizations around the world

Orangutan seller busted at hotel

JAKARTA (JP): City police detectives arrested on Monday evening bird seller Wiyadi in a parking lot at Hotel Sheraton Bandara in Tangerang for selling a protected animal — orangutan (*Pongo Pygmaeus*).

Businessman to be tried for keeping protected animals

JAKARTA (JP): A businessman will soon be tried for keeping 40 protected animals at his Puncak weekend resort in West Java.

The Forest Protection and Nature Conservation Agency director general, Soemarmo, said here yesterday that the businessman, whom he only identified as SK, was caught keeping the animals at his villa in Tugu Selatan, Puncak, last week.

He said the animals included nine Borneo orangutans (*Pongo pygmaeus*), two Sumatran rhinos (*Hylobates snyderi*), a macaque (*Macaca leonina*), a Java gibbon (*Glyptotarbata*), four red howlers (*Paradisea rubra*), a protected serpent eagle

(*Spilornis cheela paku*), 20 species of birds of paradise and two blue birds of paradise.

"The businessman claimed that keeping the animals was his hobby but none of the pets has been registered with the Ministry of Forestry," Soemarmo said.

He said the dossier of SK's animals has been sent to the police who will process it and submit it to prosecution's office, he added.

"If found guilty SK could be subject to five years imprisonment and a maximum Rp 100 million (US\$43,500) fine," he said.

"The protected animals are being kept in his villa for material evidence during court hearings because the agency

arrested after police detectives received a tip-off that the 28-year-old suspect was trying to sell an orangutan.

The Article carries a maximum sentence of five years in jail and a fine of Rp 100 million.

Wiyadi, a bird seller, conceded that he bought the six-month-old orangutan at the Barito animal market on Jl. Barito in Kebayoran Lama, Jakarta, a month ago.

"It's a protected animal, I offered me the Rp 1.75 million," he said. "I took care of the animal at his house in Klender area, East Jakarta for a month."

"On Monday, a foreigner dropped by my stall in the market, and bargained for the animal," he said.

"I finally agreed to sell for Rp 1 million. The foreigner, who asked him to go to the Hotel Sheraton Bandara

by taxi. I was waiting for him in the parking area," he said. "The foreigner paid him Rp 1 million and took the animal."

Soemarmo said that his office had sent following a tip from SK's neighbors.

According to the law, anyone who wants to keep protected animals should register them with the ministry and follow certain rules. They must be capable of feeding them and taking care of them and their health, Soemarmo said.

The ministry was enforcing a regulation passed in 1963 which allowed the owner of protected animals to keep their animals provided they registered their pets with the ministry before 1993. Possessing a protected animal is now prohibited. (JP)

Carbon, Conventions, Conservation

- BOS manages more than 540.000 hectares of tropical rain forest, mostly peat with more than 5Gt of CO₂ and intends to sign a carbon offset agreement with Shell
- BOS is developing a CDM project in another site on 1600 hectares, with 1762 tree species and very detailed research planting more than 1000 trees every day

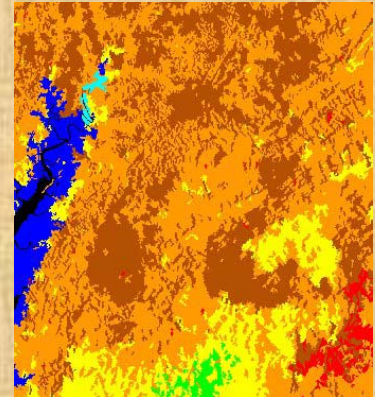


The BOS Samboja Lestari Project

- BOS works with Wetlands Internationals and others to protect the Central Kalimantan peat domes
- BOS works with local people to protect the forests and has its own law enforcement units using the satellite and microlight data
